

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is a free book gifting program administered by the Salina Area United Way and Ellsworth Counties. A free ageappropriate book is mailed to participants each month. The program is paid in full by the Dane G. Hansen Foundation in their 26 counties. Partnering with Saline County Health Department, Heartland Early Education, Child Care Aware of Kansas, and childcare centers, over 155,500 books have been mailed to date.



VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) is an IRS-sponsored program which assists in income tax preparation for Basic Federal Tax Returns and electronic filing, State of Kansas Tax Returns, Earned Income Tax Credits, and Homestead Tax Credits for moderate and low-income individuals and families making \$56,000 per year or less. Salina Area United Way in the last 6 years has done over 7,500 returns and more than \$7.6 million has come back in refunds. The Salina Area United Way is the sponsoring agency for the VITA program in our area. VITA is completely free to participants and completely volunteer run.



FamilyWize prescription drug discount cards for prescription medication are for everyone, with or without insurance. There are no usage, age or income limits. Show the FW card or the mobile app on your phone to the pharmacist. The discount, on average 45%, varying by medication, is applied to your prescription medicine and accepted at pharmacies nationwide.



RAWR (Raising Active Wild Readers) helps to prevent the "Summer Slide" by encouraging kids to read during the summer. Partnering with the USD 305 Free Summer Meals Program and the Salina Public Library, Salina Area United Way volunteers and staff distribute books at grab and go meal sites. Youth select free books, which are theirs to keep for their home-library. The program runs throughout the summer at meal sites in Salina. Over 3,600 books were distributed this summer, 2022, and more then 16,000 books have been given out in 8 years.

FutureNow: Finance

Imagine being able to see ten years into the future. Saline County high school students may participate in a fast-paced, hands-on financial literacy exercise. Students complete a survey describing their lives as 26-year-olds: their jobs, wages, family, homes, shopping habits, and entertainment. Results are compared with school performance, and then students are assigned fictional jobs, salaries and families. Students are challenged, using their salaries, to purchase life necessities: child care, transportation, groceries home, utilities, etc., plus plan for fun things like vacations and entertainment.
